RESOLUTION 8-1

WHEREAS, the Central Illinois Enforcement Group (CIEG) has operated as a multi-jurisdictional drug task force enforcing the laws associated with the Controlled Substances Act and the Cannabis Control Act since 1986 and is governed by a policy board which meets quarterly; and

WHEREAS, CIEG conducts street-level, mid-level, and upper-level drug investigations to identify networks of drug traffickers and identify the source of supply to the region of CIEG's responsibility, and

WHEREAS, CIEG also investigates illegal gun sales and gun possessions which are used in the commission of drug crimes, and

WHEREAS, CIEG investigates highway interdictions of large quantities of narcotics and currency which is primarily connected with source regions of the country, such as the Southwest U.S. border and source destination cities such as Chicago, Illinois, and

WHEREAS, CIEG accomplishes these investigations with the use of undercover officers, confidential informants, Official Advanced Funds, and various uses of technical surveillance and data recovery, and

WHEREAS, CIEG utilizes court ordered overhears, pen registers, subpoenas, and search warrants to routinely investigate narcotics cases, and

WHEREAS, CIEG coordinates the intelligence sharing as well as prosecution with state, local, and federal agencies throughout the area of the CIEG's responsibility which includes Cass County, Christian County, Logan County, Mason County, Menard County, Morgan County and Sangamon County, and

WHEREAS, the Finance Committee approved the Grant Request on September 11, 2018 with an award amount of \$55,428 and \$1,500 in matching Funds from the General Fund,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the members of the Sangamon County Board, in session on this 11th day of September 2018, that the Comprehensive Law Enforcement Response to Drugs Grant be accepted by Sangamon County.
